
AUSTRALIA

FIONA SMITH

It shouldn't surprise anyone that Fiona Smith paints birds. She was raised on the fringes of a national park in Sydney, where the wildlife was far more plentiful than willing human playmates. With no urban playgrounds nearby, her childhood centred around forging friendships with the feathered and furred creatures that strayed onto her parents' property, set on McCarrs Creek in Sydney's Northern Beaches.

Fiona left that idyll to study journalism at Bathurst, in the Central West region of New South Wales, and returned to Sydney to forge a career in media, becoming a prominent business reporter and columnist for the Australian Financial Review newspaper. During that time, she studied parttime at the Julian Ashton Art School in Sydney and also attended workshops and classes with some of Australia's most successful contemporary artists.

Fiona now works full-time as an artist and her oil paintings primarily focus on elaborate and patterned bird works. The birds appear in interior settings, posed on furniture and objects and against vintage and antique wallpapers. The effect is to show the natural beauty of the bird while expressing something of its personality.





FROM THE ARTIST...

Birds can span the boundary between the natural world and our human-made environments. They pass easily between the two, reminding us of our own connection to nature as they visit us on our balconies or follow us in the garden.

I want to create objects of beauty that also pay homage to some of the incredible designs that have turned houses into homes over centuries. It is thrilling to unearth the accomplished handiwork of women and men whose names are usually only familiar to those who haunt antique auctions.







MELISSA HARTLEY

Melissa Hartley's depictions of flowers, fruit and other household objects suspend time in an ode to the golden age of 17th century Dutch still life painting.

Melissa's detailed labour offers us an alternative to the clamour of disposable society to update and discard, urging us to slow down and to reflect on beauty all around us and appreciate the precious nature of our time.

Favouring the use of chiaroscuro, she creates high tonal contrast between her shadowy charcoal backgrounds and illuminated subjects.

Melissa has been a finalist in many art prizes, including the Kilgour Prize, Mosman Art Prize and EMSLA Still Life Award. In 2017 she won the North Sydney Art Prize's Award for Painting.



BEN TANKARD

Ben Tankard is a painter living and working in the Blue Mountains. He worked for 15 years in a bookstore prior to becoming a full-time artist five years ago. Books and art have been lifelong obsessions and Ben often combines the two.

The primary artistic inspiration for his works is twentieth century artist Jasper Johns, who took iconic images such as the American flag and recreated them as abstract paintings, rich with texture. Ben takes popular book covers and boardgames and recreates them on canvas in a dramatic way, with thick overlapping layers of paint, drips, splatters and splashes. This contest between the original clean designs and the expressionistic paintwork results in fresh, energetic works that also appeal to our sense of nostalgia.

Ben studied Fine Arts at the University of Western Sydney and has been a finalist in the Mosman Art Prize, Sulman Prize, Calleen Art Award and the Gallipoli Art Prize, and was the winner of the 2019 Hawkesbury Art Prize.







MELBOURNE 2023

Monopoly streets large enough to walk on, dotted with the oversized hotels and houses up to your waist were a magnet for visitors at the Melbourne Affordable Art Fair this year. Entirely hand-built and painted by Ben Tankard, the installation was the result of many months of preparation.

National media also joined the buzzing atmosphere, with ABC News reporting that one of his paintings sold while it was still on the easel and yet to be completed! "I wanted to create something really fun and playful." Ben commented, "There's a sense of randomness and unpredictability in Monopoly, similar to life - a roll of the dice can lead to fortune, disaster, mundanity or the very strange and unexpected."














MELANIE VUGICH

Melanie Vugich grew up in the New South Wales town of Broken Hill then spent time in Adelaide, Sydney and London before venturing to Italy. She fell in love with Florence and lived there for 25 years, working as a fabric designer for high-end fashion labels and painting in her spare time.

Relocating to the Sydney suburb of Bronte in 2010, Melanie now paints full-time and focuses on the still life genre, which allows her to celebrate the beauty of Australian native flowers and everyday household items.

In May 2023, Melanie's work appeared on the cover of popular Australian magazine *frankie*. She has also been featured by *Vogue Australia* and appears in *STILL LIFE*, by author/curator Amber Creswell Bell, which was published by Thames & Hudson Australia in 2021 and features over 40 prominent Australian artists.

Melanie's work is held in private collections around Australia and in Denmark, Italy, France, Germany, London, Singapore and the US.





FROM THE ARTIST ...

Each year my partner and I head to his Calabrian hometown, where we have a small house and savour the opportunity to break our usual routines and relax with longtime friends. Life slows to a leisurely pace and fresh inspiration is found in simple things... Lazy beach days, strolls through bountiful orchards, visits to local produce markets and dinner at rustic restaurants present an abundance of colour and beauty that I capture via photos and illustrations.

Back in my Sydney studio a few weeks later, my work naturally takes on a distinctly Italian flavour. Shades of rust, gold and pink serve as the backdrop for new tablescapes, with handpainted Italian ceramics, fleshy fruits and art books from my Calabrian library set amid banksias and king proteas.

I love the juxtaposition; the coming together of my two homes; the way vintage and modern everyday items sit in harmony on my dining table. I also love that these paintings are being shown in Singapore, my favourite city to stay for a few days on those long trips from Sydney to Italy and back!





Having dedicated the past 30 years to his art practice, Phillip has held multiple solo shows and participated in many group exhibitions.

As a 2018 finalist of the prestigious Wynne Prize, hosted by the Art Gallery of New South Wales, Phillip was awarded the Trustees Watercolour Prize. He has also been a finalist in the Calleen Art Award, Flow Contemporary Watercolour Prize and the Lester Prize for portraiture.























